

CRESTWOOD Senior Class of 2023 ~ Paint Your Own Parking Spot Application

Rules & Requirements

1. All required paperwork, including a color sketch of your design, parking permit application (drivers license/insurance), signed student contract, and check/cash for **\$55.00** made out to **Crestwood Student Activities** must be turned in together to the office on one of the following dates: August 15th from 9-Noon, August 16th from 11-2, or August 17th from 9-Noon. No applications will be accepted after 12 PM on August 17th. All forms should be brought to the office and handed into Mrs. Zavacky and Mrs. Walck. Lottery results and spaces will be posted on google classroom on 8/21/22.
2. All Designs are subject to administration approval. Your design should be clearly drawn on the attached form and must include the colors you will be using on your parking spot. You must paint exactly the same image on your parking space that is on your Parking Spot Design Request Form or you will lose your parking space.
3. You are responsible for purchasing your own paint and supplies and for being able to paint your spot. **Water-based, exterior latex paint is the only type of paint that can be used. Your paint must be approved prior to painting. Paint may be purchased at stores like Lowes, Home Depot, A&R Building Supplies, or Sherwin Williams.**
 - a. **No reflective paint**
 - b. **No spray paint**
 - c. **No fluorescent paint**
4. Students must keep a 4-inch margin around outside the entire parking space.
5. Upon application and approval, the parking spot you are assigned is yours (NOT to be shared with friends) Monday-Friday, 7:00 AM-2:30 PM. Please notify the main office or security if someone is parked in your space.
6. **Students who are painting spaces will choose one of the following dates: August 22, 2022 Monday-5-8 PM; August 23, 2022 Tuesday 9-Noon; August 26, 2022 Friday 11-2 PM. ALL SPOTS MUST BE PAINTED BY 8/26/2022. NO PAINTING WILL BE ALLOWED UNSUPERVISED. Signups will be held via google form after registration closes on 8/17/2022**
7. All students painting a parking spot must have already purchased a Crestwood Senior Parking Permit.

Materials Needed:

- Latex paint - EXTERIOR - Water Based (NO oil-based paints, reflective, spray, or reflective paints)
- Brushes, rollers or sponges to apply paint (nothing else is permitted)
- Masking Tape to mark off 4-inch border from white lines
- Stool or towel to sit on
- Chalk to sketch design
- Broom to sweep spot
- Plastic drop cloth to put under paint cans
- Plastic containers for water, paint and brushes
- Sunscreen, hat, sunglasses, water, snacks, pop up tent (for shade)

Design Criteria

- No offensive language or gang symbols
- No double meanings
- Clean nicknames, no girlfriend/boyfriend names etc. (ONLY your name)
- Must be school appropriate
- All designs must be submitted for approval by administration on August 15th, 16th, or 17th at the designated times above.
- Prohibited items will be painted over in black at the discretion of the administration and disciplinary action may be taken.

Painting Tips:

- Begin with a base coat of white/black or gray. The paint on top will last longer.
- Bring brushes, rollers and/or sponges to apply paint and chalk to draw out your design.
- Bring a broom to clean your spot prior to painting.
- Use tape to create clean lines or consider making a stencil ahead of time.
- Limit your paint palette or go in with a friend to share colors (quarts of paint can get expensive!)
- Check out what you may already have at home (open it first to make sure it is still usable and the right kind!)
- Check out Pinterest for great ideas!

- Painting must be completed in the 3 hour allotment that you are given. (so come on time!!!)

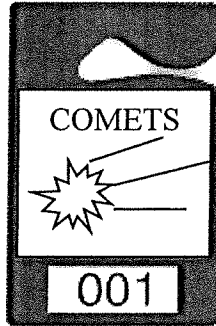

2022-2023 STUDENT PARKING GUIDELINES

Students are to apply for driving permits during the time designated by the building administration. Students may register each car they drive to school upon verification of driver's license, auto registration, and insurance coverage. Parents must sign the application, which must be returned for approval by the building administrator. Once approved, a registration tag will be issued. The completed applications are to be returned to Mrs. Liz Walck. The fee for a parking permit is \$5.00. All students will be issued a receipt for payment when the parking permit is granted.

Permits will be assigned to seniors and juniors until all parking spaces are filled on a first come first serve basis. If requests exceed the number of available spaces students will be placed on a waiting list and presented with a permit as soon as possible.

Permits must be always displayed on the rear-view mirror on school property. Vehicle violations include, but are not limited to, the following offenses:

Parking without a permit

Parking in an unauthorized area

Driving in the bus lane

Reckless driving on school property

1st offense – Students will be given a warning

2nd offense – Students may be subjected to the loss of parking/driving privileges

3rd offense – Disciplinary action and removal of parking permit for an extended period.

*It is important to note that when a parking permit is revoked, the school district is not revoking the student's right to drive, but rather the privilege to park on school district property. Students in violation of parking guidelines may have their vehicle towed at the expense of the owner.

The Crestwood School District policy of weapons, smoking, drugs and alcohol applies to student transportation. Students will not possess, use, furnish, or sell controlled substances or alcohol from vehicles on school grounds. Violations will be dealt with according to Crestwood School District policy.

Students are expected to abide by all driving and traffic regulations established under the vehicle code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Students who violate this code on school property will immediately lose their parking permits for a minimum of thirty (30) school days. Students are not permitted in the parking lot or in their cars without authorization from the building administration.
